

COURSE TITLE

ARA Certified Mobile Elevating Work Platform (MEWP) Train-the-Trainer

COURSE DESCRIPTION

ARA's MEWP Train-the-Trainer course qualifies professionals to train MEWP operators – both employees and customers – using ARA materials that satisfy OSHA requirements, ANSI standards, and CSA standards. During this course, the learner will complete the self-paced, online portion through RentalU and then complete the in-person, hands-on portion of the training facilitated by an ARA Certified MEWP Instructor.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

After completing this course, you will be able to:

- Prepare to operate a MEWP by reading the manufacturer's operation and safety manuals as well as the data plate
- Complete a thorough workplace assessment and pre-start inspection of a MEWP
- Operate a MEWP in a safe and efficient manner
- Perform the correct parking and shut down procedure for the MEWP
- Train your employees and customers to become ARA Certified MEWP Operators

PREREQUISITES

To enroll and complete this course, you must:

- Be at least 20 years old (at least 18 years old plus 2 years of experience)
- Work for a company with ARA membership
- Hold certification as a MEWP operator for at least 2 years, with no significant lapses in operating a MEWP during that time *OR* gain approval after submitting Prerequisite for ARA Certified MEWP Train-the-Trainer form
- Have experience with the particular kind(s) of MEWPs used in the in-person training
- Have sufficient knowledge of the regulations, manufacturer's requirements, and safe use practices
- Have the ability to identify and avoid hazards associated with MEWPs and worksites
- Have the capacity to read and understand English
- Be physically and mentally able to operate a MEWP

METHOD OF INSTRUCTION AND WORK EXPECTATIONS

The theory portion of this course will be delivered entirely online through the course management system RentalU. You will use your ARA Rental account to login to the course from the ararental.org webpage. In RentalU, you will access online modules, course materials, and resources. The course will take learners approximately 4.5 hours to complete.

The in-person, hands-on portion will be facilitated by an ARA Certified MEWP Instructor and will take learners approximately 4 hours to complete.

EVALUATION AND GRADING CRITERIA

Learners will complete knowledge checks throughout the course. There is a final exam at the end of the online theory portion. Learners must earn 80% or better to pass. Then, the learner will complete an in-person, hands-on training and evaluation.

Once successfully complete, the learner will receive an ARA Certified MEWP Operator certification card and an ARA Certified MEWP Train-the-Trainer certification card. The operator certification and the train-the-trainer certification both expire 5 years after the date of issue.

STANDARD POLICIES

- The learner has 90 days to complete the theory portion after starting the course, and it must be completed at least 48 hours *prior* to the hands-on training. The in-person, hands-on portion of the training must be completed within 90 days after completing and passing the theory portion. If the learner fails to complete the course within this timeframe, the learner may be required to repurchase the course. The learner can contact the Education Department to request an extension.
- Learners are expected to adhere to the ARA Rental standards for academic integrity. Academic dishonesty in any portion of the academic work for a course/program shall be grounds for removal from the course/program. You are expected to do your own academic work. Failing to do so is scholastic dishonesty. Scholastic dishonesty means cheating on quizzes; engaging in unauthorized collaboration on academic work; taking, acquiring, or using test materials without association permission; or submitting false or incomplete records of prerequisite achievement.
- Learners may not record, livestream, screen capture, or redistribute any materials from this course/program without advanced written consent of ARA. Failure to comply with requirements regarding recordings may result in legal action.
