The importance of refresher training in safety

Research shows that within one hour, people will have forgotten an average of 50 percent of the information you presented.

The forgetting curve:

If they have done nothing with that information, didn't think about it again, read it again, etc., then within 24 hours, they have forgotten an average of 70 percent of new information.
